THIRD JOINT STATUS REPORT

Respondents IFS International Forwarding, S.L., IFS Neutral Maritime Service, Inc. (collectively, "IFS") and Crowley Caribbean Logistics, LLC ("CCL") hereby submit this Joint Status Report pursuant to the August 14, 2014 Discovery Schedule. We have circulated this Joint Status Report to counsel for Complaint, Edaf Antillas, Inc. ("Edaf") but have not yet received a response, therefore IFS and CCL are submitting this Joint Status Report. The Parties apologize for the delay in providing this Joint Status Report.

The First Joint Status Report in this matter was filed August 11, 2014. The Second Joint Status Report in this matter was filed October 10, 2014. At the time the Second Joint Status Report was filed, IFS' and CCL's motions to dismiss Edaf's complaint were pending before the Presiding Judge. The Presiding Judge issued his Order on Motions to Dismiss November 6, 2014, which Order granted in part and denied in part IFS' and CCL's motions. This Order became administratively final pursuant to the Secretary's December 8, 2014 Notice Not to Review.

Pursuant to the August 14, 2014 Discovery Schedule, answers to interrogatories were due October 23, 2014 and responses to document demands were due October 30,

2014. On October 21, 2014 the Parties stipulated to extending the due date for answers to interrogatories to October 30, 2014 and extending the due date for responses to document demands to November 6, 2014.

IFS and CCL provided answers to Edaf's interrogatories, which also called for the production of documents, on October 30, 2014.

On November 6, 2014, Edaf requested a one week extension to respond to IFS' and CCL's interrogatories and document demands due to a significant family matter. IFS and CCL consented to such extension that same date. The new date for responses to IFS' and CCL's discovery demands was November 13, 2014.

Edaf advised IFS in a telephone conversation on November 20, 2014 that it required additional time to respond to IFS' discovery demands due to the significant family matter. Edaf subsequently served responses to IFS' and CCL's discovery demands at close of business on December 5, 2014.

IFS noticed the deposition of Edaf for December 11, 2014. Edaf has requested that the deposition date be adjourned until December 18, 2014. IFS has consented to this requested adjournment.

In its December 5, 2014 responses to IFS' interrogatories, Edaf identified accountant Salvadore Lugo Cosme as a person with knowledge of the damages Edaf claims in this matter. IFS has noticed Mr. Cosme's deposition for December 18, 2014 at 1600. It is unlikely that this deposition can take place on the date noticed and will likely need to be rescheduled for a later date, likely after the holidays.

In view of the additional time Edaf required to respond to discovery and the present state of discovery in this matter, the Parties agree that an extension of the discovery schedule is necessary. The Parties have thus agreed to an extension of the deadline for the completion of depositions to January 19, 2014, and have also agreed to an extension of the deadline for the close of fact discovery to February 9, 2014. There will be no expert discovery in this matter. The Parties therefore respectfully request an order modifying the present discovery schedule.

The Parties further respectfully request that the proposed schedule for the submission of proposed findings of fact, appendices and briefs be postponed until the next joint status report.

There are currently no other motions pending in this matter at this time.


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
