ORDER ON COMPLAINANT'S MOTION TO EXTEND TIME

On February 25, 2015, Complainant Econocaribe Consolidators, Inc. ("Econocaribe") filed a motion seeking to extend the time to file its proposed findings of fact and initial brief ("Motion"). The motion indicated that Respondent Amoy International, LLC ("Amoy") did not agree with the request. On March 6, 2015, a telephone status conference was held and the parties were provided an opportunity to present arguments on the motion.

Having considered the parties arguments, it is hereby


ORDERED that Complainants' motion to compel be **GRANTED IN PART** and **DENIED IN PART**. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that the parties abide by the following schedule:

April 2, 2015:	Complainant's initial brief, proposed findings of fact, and appendix are due.
May 4, 2015:	Respondent's opposition brief, proposed findings of fact, responses to Complainant's proposed findings of fact, and appendix are due.
May 18, 2015:	Complainant's reply brief and responses to Respondent's proposed findings of fact are due. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that Complainant's initial brief and Respondent's opposition brief may each not exceed eighty pages, excluding the findings of fact, responses to findings of fact, and appendix. Complainant's reply brief may not exceed forty pages. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that the parties review the October 2, 2014, scheduling order issued in this case for other requirements of the parties' briefs, findings of facts, and appendices.
