
As you may recall, I am the attorney for the Complainant in the above captioned matter. I am writing in response to respondent's recent letter of March 20, 2015 in which respondents object to the release of the Baltic Auto Shipping Corp. documents (i.e. the 21 bookings in attachment "A" previously discussed with Your Honor and with counsel for the respondents).

In light of respondents' allegations of coercion between the Baltic/Baltic relationship, I am writing to advise the Commission that I have been retained to represent Baltic Auto Shipping Corp. ("Baltic Savannah") with respect to any matters currently before this Commission, as well as any Federal Court matters that involve Baltic Savannah and that may be related to the instant matter. Baltic Savannah advises me that there have been no instances of "coercion" between the Complainant and Baltic Savannah, as alleged in the respondents' letter of March 20, 2015.

By copy of this letter, I am also advising the respondents to cease all communications with Baltic Savannah, and to direct all further communications with Baltic Savannah directly to the undersigned.
