- I. The Claimant is a 501 (c)(3) multi-faith based nonprofit organization based out of West Palm Beach, Florida. The Eagles Wings Foundation is primarily a disaster relief organization which provides short term mass care relief to impacted survivors following a catastrophic event.
- II. The respondent named above is a corporation named Chatelain Cargo Services. They provided the Eagles Wings Foundation logistics solutions by facilitating customs clearance for incoming goods to Haiti, then were supposed to stage them at their warehouse in Port Au Prince. One container never was delivered to Eagles Wings.
- III. The Eagles Wings Foundation is pursuing this informal complaint due to an incident that occurred in Haiti when Chatelain Cargo Services failed to deliver a 40' pallet full of donated MREs to the Eagles Wings Foundation's point of contact in country named Jean Charles. The estimated worth of the contents of the shipment is \$48,470.
- IV. This claim is not regarding overcharges, it is regarding more than 20,000 meals that were never delivered by Chatelain.
- V. The statute that has been broken is **Section 10(d) (1) of the Shipping Act of 1984**, which states that: "No common carrier, ocean transportation intermediary or marine terminal operation may fail to establish, observe, and enforce just and reasonable regulations and practices relating to or connected with receiving, handling, storing, or delivering property.
- VI. The Eagles Wings Foundation lost approximately \$48,470 in donated meal rations that were supposed to be delivered to the impacted survivors in Haiti following the earthquake.
- VII. The undersigned authorizes the Settlement Officer to determine the above stated claim pursuant to the informal procedure outlined in subpart S (46 CFR 502.301-502.305) of the Commission's informal procedure for adjudication of small claims subject to discretionary Commission review.



Before the undersigned, an officer duly commissioned by the laws of Florida, on this 18th day of December, 2010, personally appeared Scott P. Lewis, who having been first duly sworn depose and say:

I swear the following is true and will be willing to testify to the same:

My name is Scott Lewis and I am the President of the Eagles' Wings Foundation (hereinafter "Eagles Wings"), a 501.c.3 public foundation. Eagles' Wings operated in Haiti from Jan. 14, 2010 through August 17, 2010 on earthquake relief efforts. In early April, 2010, I met with Phillipe Chatelain of Chatelain Cargo Services, S.A. (collectively referred to as "Chatelain") on the 3<sup>rd</sup> deployment, and arranged for his company to be the Haitian based, broker for Eagles Wings for donated goods (see my own email attachments as Exh A). I confirmed Chatelain also had offices in Miami, Florida before making this decision so that we would have a company with a US base, and therefore a bonded, shipping firm to hold responsible for our relief supplies. The product from one of Eagles Wings' 40' shipping containers under Chatelain's control disappeared, and therefore this complaint is being filed.

Soon after filing for mediation from the Federal Maritime Commission almost 6 months ago, Chatelain and his partner called me now explaining that Chatelain has two companies, not one, Chatelain Cargo Services, SA and Chatelain Cargo Services in the U.S.A. Phillippe Chatelain, the responsible party I dealt with throughout this ordeal, owns 50% of each. This newly revealed duplicitous name is nothing more than a bait and switch scheme to evade the jurisdiction of the Federal Maritime Commission. Even if somehow Chatelain's lawyers are able to escape responsibility through some loophole technicality, the Federal Maritime Commission should know that our not for profit trying to send desperately needed food goods was duped into thinking this was a U.S. company, and I am sure other US companies will be tricked as well.

On Eagles Wings' 4<sup>th</sup> deployment on April 27th, 5 shipping containers containing pallets of water, durable medical hard goods, and MREs (Meals Ready to Eat) were brought into Port Au Prince on the Caribe Sun through Chatelain's brokerage company, as confirmed in the attached email and manifest (See Ex. B). Chatelain also sent me the Bill of Lading (see Ex. C). There were three 20' containers and two 40' containers, with 18" large painted letters on the outside saying "Eagles Wings."

During our 4<sup>th</sup> deployment, I met again with Phillippe Chatelain at his offices in Port au Prince with an Eagles Wings volunteer (A Haitian national with a passport living in the US) named Jean Charles to assure that we had the proper process in place to promptly receive our donated goods. When we met, I clearly and repeatedly told Chatelain that Jean Charles would be Eagles Wings' local agent, and that no one except him should receive our containers once they

were released from Customs. On May 24, following Chatelain's specific instructions, I sent a specific Excel sheet filled in to Chatelain with Jean Charles listed as the Point of Contact for all five containers (see Exh. D).

For a host of reasons, the release of the shipment was delayed, and I left to return to the US, leaving Jean Charles there to receive and distribute the donated goods. After numerous delays, Jean Charles returned to the US. Then on June 28<sup>th</sup>, Chatelain notified me by email that the containers were being released from Customs, and Jean Charles returned to Haiti on July 7<sup>th</sup> to finally secure receipt of the containers. A flurry of contacts happened to Chatelain by email, by phone, and in person by Jean Charles (more emails attached as Exh. E). Then, on July 20<sup>th</sup>, I received a call from Jean Charles that Chatelain said he had delivered the first container to Mathilde at Handicap International (the crutches in one small container were owned by Handicap International, but their shipping was donated by Eagles Wings). I promptly called Mathilde, and she informed me Handicap International had not received a container from Eagles Wings and had told Chatelain to deliver all of the containers to Jean Charles as well. She also called Chatelain and he acted very confused as to where the 40' container had been delivered. We discussed notifying the Haitian National Police, but with our need to secure the other containers, we held off so we could at least get the rest of our donated goods.

Then, starting around July 25, Jean Charles finally began receiving the other four containers from Chatelain services, with Chatelain's trucks delivering each sealed container to Jean Charles (more emails at Exh F). Jean Charles kept the actual wire seals from each of the four as well.

On Aug. 17<sup>th</sup>, Jean Charles went in to Chatelain Cargo Services and met with Philippe-Victor Chatelain who again told him that, despite our arrangement that Jean Charles was the only one who could accept delivery of an Eagles Wings' container, he had shipped and released the first container to someone else. As pre-arranged with Jean Charles, Jean Charles then called me on his cell phone and passed the phone to Chatelain. When I spoke with Chatelain, I asked him for documentation to prove that he had released the container to Handicapped International. He stated that it would take too long to find the proper documentation and told me that he would write something up in the office right then. I expressed my frustration at his not having the proper documentation for sealed container deliveries under his firm's control and told him Mathilde already had verified she had NOT received the container, but had received the crutches directly from Jean Charles (noting again the crutches were in another container he did receive). After Chatelain hung up, he then tried to get Jean Charles to sign a document saying he had received all 5 containers from Chatelain's truckers (see Affidavit of Jean Charles). Jean Charles refused to sign the document, and we then tried to have others intervene to have Chatelain produce the donated food from the missing container.

The missing contents of the forty foot container were 36 pallets of MRE's. Each pallet had 48 cases of 576 complete meals. The number of the container we never received is GSTU 8839055-5 (Exh. H). Chatelain Cargo Services shipped the container under its care, custody and control to some unknown address to some unknown party with its Haitian Custom's seal still in place and in spite of all the directives to deal only with Jean Charles in this regards. To establish a value, research was done for a bulk purchase of such humanitarian relief, and the

cheapest cost was found at \$42.50 per case (see Exh. G). Eagles Wings discounted that cost by 33% (a reasonable profit margin from a wholesaler), and came to a total value of \$48,470 (48 cases X 36 pallets X \$42.50 per case X 66% = \$48,470). Eagles Wings also incurred considerable costs related to these donations such as the expenses related to re-certifying the MRE's through the US Army, forklifts and labor plus costs in New Orleans for securing shipping, trucking to Ft. Pierce, and more costs there for handling and re-packing in the containers at the port in Ft. Pierce. Those additional costs are reserved as an additional claim if Eagles Wings is forced to proceed in court.

As the President of Eagles Wings Foundation, we would petition the Federal Maritime Commission to assign this complaint a case number and to begin an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the "loss" of our donated goods in Haiti, while they were under the care, custody and control of Chatelain Cargo Services S.A. It is our understanding that this company is under the control of the Federal Maritime Commission because Chatelain's has offices in Miami, Florida. Also, even if Chatelain should now suddenly produce signed delivery papers for the missing container, there is no question that it was delivered to someone else other than the specific Point of Contact and responsible party for Eagles Wings, the owner of the container, as noticed to Chatelain on their own required form (see Exh. D). Eagles Wings also intends to proceed to secure a claim against Chatelain Cargo Services bond and is willing to pursue all legal alternatives to recover the value of the goods under the firm's care, custody, and control. Additional documentation will be available other than the attached if we are forced to proceed further.



Before the undersigned, an officer duly commissioned by the laws of Florida, on this 22 day of December, 2010, personally appeared Jean Estiva Charles who having been first duly sworn depose and say:

I swear the following is true and will be willing to testify to the same:

The Eagles Wings Foundation (EWF) operated in Haiti immediately following this year's earthquake. I am a US citizen, born in Haiti, living in the United States, and have college experience with emergency management. I was a volunteer for Eagles Wings on 5 deployments for this not for profit. During my April - August, 2010 deployments, I had numerous face-to-face and phone call contacts with Phillipe Victor Chatelain, a principle of Chatelain Cargo Services S.A., at his offices in Port au Prince. During this time, Chatelain was the Haitian custom's broker representing Eagles Wings to bring in donated supplies after the earthquake.

On my first meeting with Chatelain at his office with Scott Lewis, the President of Eagles Wings, I witnessed Scott Lewis specifically direct Chatelain to exclusively deal with me as the only point of contact for Eagles Wings, except for himself, for delivery of the first 5 containers coming in on a ship named the Caribe Sun. Chatelain laid out pricing to both of us and agreed to use me as the only local point of contact in this first meeting early April, 2010.

During the course of the 4<sup>th</sup> deployment, the Eagles Wings Foundation brought in 5 containers containing relief supplies through Chatelain Cargo Services. Because of various unknown delays, one container finally was trucked out on or about July 20<sup>th</sup>. The next morning, July 21<sup>th</sup> I received a call from Mr. Chatelain telling me, even I had been calling him almost every day since my arrival on this 4<sup>th</sup> deployment starting on July 5<sup>th</sup>, but somehow, he unilaterally decided to not deliver this first container to me. He said he took it to Handicap International instead, but I was in regular communication by phone with its lead representative in Port au Prince, Mathilde, and she checked and re-checked to confirm Chatelain did NOT deliver that first container to her group either. She and I repeatedly asked Chatelain for the address of delivery, and he never gave it to me or to her. I also received a number of emails Scott Lewis about this issue too.

On instructions by phone from Scott Lewis, I focused on getting the other 3 containers out before they disappeared as well, instead of going to the local police (which were in

disarray in any case from the earthquake). When each subsequent delivery was made to me, the drivers made sure I signed documents receiving each container, and each one I received had a Custom's wire seal on its outside, which I first inspected and then cut open. Each one also had very large painted letters on the outside saying "Eagles Wings." This delivery process by Chatelain's drivers confirmed to me that they were under strict instructions to always have someone sign for the receipt of sealed containers, which had to have been done with the 1<sup>st</sup> container as well. One Chatelain driver also told me this was their normal process.

During the next several weeks, Chatelain gave me numerous excuses about why it was taking so long for each container and more about where the first one had disappeared to. I was afraid the other containers would disappear as well. Many of these excuses directly conflicted with facts I found out from his own truck drivers. I came to not trust Chatelain because of these mistruths.

Finally, after receiving the 4<sup>th</sup> container, I went back in to Chatelain's office to ask what happened with the missing container once again. When I got in the office, I met with Phillippe Chatelain and called Scott Lewis on my cell phone as we had pre-arranged, with my knowing Scott was going to ask Chatelain for the shipping documents. Scott asked Chatelain to provide delivery documentation regarding the container he claimed had been delivered to the Handicap International. Chatelain stated in front of me that it would take too long to find the proper documentation, and that he would write something up in the office. When he hung up, he drafted up a receipt that stated all 5 containers had been delivered to me. Since this was not true and I only received 4 containers, I left the office without signing his false receipt. He did write me a check to buy 4 of the empty containers (I sold 1 empty one from Eagles Wings to Mr. Denis), confirming he had gotten the first empty container once again.

Dear Vicky,

I am a Rotarian in Haiti and I'll be handling the operation in Haiti when the barge arrives in Haiti as I am also a freight forwarder. Rotary of Clubs of my district has been nice enough to accept that I cease the opportunity to ship empty containers for free to PAP to be used as shelters for several organizations. The demand for empty containers for school, hospitals, homes are immense. However, I know there will be some cost involved for the logistic that I don't want to be charged to the Rotary. I will pay for the trucking of the containers to the port and their loading to the vessel.

It is very important that you keep those charges separate and that you bill them to me directly or that you identify them so well that I am able to deduct them from any charges I'll be paying on behalf of the Rotary at destination when they arrive.

Good day Scott,

I am happy that you and Bobby entertained the idea of joint forces for the benefit of the children his association but in general, for all my fellow Haitian who benefit one way or another from his program, I thank you again for your good heart.

As for the rates are determined by sub-contractors and I cannot guarantee they will remain the same all year long. Also, because of the nature of your organization, I gave you almost what my cost are (trucking of containers and unloading of container to chassis) but if I have to pay those charges for you, I will apply a small 5-10% fee for putting the money on your behalf.

Cash flow has become a critical issue and I must apply a small fee for paying cash the contractors and billing my clients.

I will not apply any charges on the \$87.00 for the loading of containers to the chassis but I will apply \$15.00 to every delivery of containers within the city limit of PAP.

We did not discuss the charges for the tax exemption formalities should we have to do it for you. Once you confirm that Bobby is legally able to receive shipments under the name of his organization, I will have to charge you a fee for going through the ministries. So here are the final charges for a full service including customs clearance, tax exemption formalities, documentation and delivery.

Let me know if you agree with the additional charges so I can put them on my file.

Remember that once you receive a container shipper own, you must discharge it on the ground. Please do not forget that proposal for moving forward so that we may plan accordingly (I believe I have listed all of the items below which you could clip and copy).

Given our not for profit status, I also especially appreciate your trying to work with us on future operations in a beneficial way, such as the storage of several containers in your secure site for up to a year with a nominal monthly rental fee to cover security issues. This set up will allow us to also look to take advantage of air freight deliveries of donated goods which will be small in scale (up to 2,000 pounds per delivery) but could have a big impact, especially on the folks Bobby serves in the Citie Soleil. Having your low cost transfer fee from a plane to our containers in your yard also is extremely helpful too. Here is a recap off of that sheet we had made up of the total cost items:




