Notice of Filing of Complaint and Assignment

Notice is hereby given that the claim in this proceeding, filed by The Eagle Wings Foundation, was served this day upon the respondent named above. Chatelain Cargo Services is required to file a response together with a statement indicating whether it consents to the adjudication of this matter under the informal procedures set forth under Subpart S of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (46 C.F.R. §502.301-305), by July 18, 2011.¹ Failure by a respondent to submit a response expressly refusing the informal procedure set forth in Rule 304 of Subpart S by the stipulated date will be deemed conclusively to indicate consent to the informal procedure. A copy of any response must be forwarded to the claimant.

¹ Commission Rule 304 provides that "[i]f the respondent refuses to consent to the claim being informally adjudicated pursuant to this subpart, the claim will be considered a complaint under §502.311 and will be adjudicated under subpart T of this part." 46 C.F.R. § 502.304(f). Subpart T provides for formal procedures for adjudication of small claims.

This proceeding is assigned to Settlement Officer Tara E. Nielsen for decision. All communications pertaining to this matter should refer to Informal Docket No. 1923(I), *The Eagle Wings Foundation v. Chatelain Cargo Services* and must be addressed to Settlement Officer Tara E. Each party must ensure that a copy of any and all correspondence sent to the Settlement Officer is also sent to the other party. Each party shall attach a statement to all submissions to demonstrate that correspondence was sent to the other party.
